PUNCTUALITY

On Tuesday this week, over 20 pupils arrived at school LATE. It is your child's right to an education and it is the responsibility of parents to ensure children can access this right and arrive at school on time and every day possible.

SCHOOL STARTS AT 8:45AM AND ARRIVING AFTER THIS TIME MEANS YOU ARE LATE

IF A CHILD ARRIVES AFTER 8:55AM, THEY RECEIVE AN 'L' IN THE REGISTER AND WILL HAVE MISSED THEIR FIRST TASK OF THE DAY. IF THEY ARRIVE AFTER 9:25, THEY HAVE MISSED AN ENTIRE LESSON AND THEIR ABSENCE WILL BE UNAUTHORISED. IO UNAUTHORISED SESSIONS CAN EQUATE TO A FIXED PENALTY NOTICE AND FINE FROM THE LOCAL AUTHORITY.

We do understand that from time to time, unexpected issues arise in the mornings and some families will therefore be a little late. However, the majority of our pupils who arrive late are doing so persistently – every day in some cases. Please reflect on your responsibility as a parent and do something to change this cycle and ensure you are giving you child(ren) the best possible chance in life.

SUPPORT FOR HOUSEHOLDS

The Government has again provided a £15 supermarket voucher for each child eligible for Free School Meals this half term.

HEADLICE

Over half term, please can all children be checked and treated, if necessary, for headlice and nits please.
