
FOOD / MEAL SUPPORT & PRICES

We are pleased that the Government have announced that they will continue to provide the £15 per week supermarket vouchers to those pupils in receipt of benefit-related Free School Meals during the 6-week holiday. If you are not eligible currently, but think you may be, please speak to the office who will give you a QR code to check!

Unfortunately, due to the rise in food costs, our catering company have had to increase the price of a school meal, which means from September Ist, the new cost of a school dinner, will be £2.45 We are sorry to be adding this burden during these challenging times but thank you for your support.
