- I. Clothing: All clothes must be clean and free of stains, holes, or rips. Please ensure that items are in good condition and ready for their next owner to wear and enjoy.
- 2. Underwear: For hygiene reasons, please do not include any underwear in the items you bring to the swap shop.
- 3. Toys: Any toys brought for the swap should be complete and in full working order. This helps ensure that all children who receive new toys can immediately enjoy them without any issues.
- 4. Books' Books must have all their pages and free from rips and tears.
- 5. Small Household Items: For example, vases, ornaments, photo frames. All items must be complete without cracks or breakages.

Please bring your donations to the school office where our team of eco warriors will help sort and organise them into the relevant age, size and category.

We believe this event will be a fantastic way for our community to come together, share resources, and teach our children the value of reusing and recycling.
