

INFORMATION REGARDING POLICE INVOLVEMENT AROUND SOCIAL MEDIA USE

YEAR 2

Last year, multiple pupils were involved in police investigations based on their unsafe and vulnerable behaviour on social media, whilst at home. These investigations are still ongoing.

As a result of this, we have begun working with ProjectEVOLVE, which is an online teaching tool to support pupils and parents to understand the severity and potential consequences of their actions online.

As part of our work with ProjectEVOLVE, we assess our pupils' current knowledge and actions that they would choose based on some real-life scenarios.

YEAR 2 FINDINGS:

Scenario: My friend told me they watched a spooky video online and now they are scared all the time. How can I help them?

38% of pupils in Y2 think that they should watch the video for themselves so they can understand what scares them.

What is the correct response? Support your friend to talk to an adult you trust about why they are feeling scared.

As a school, we will then use these findings to teach our pupils the correct information to support them to make better choices whilst online.

Reminders to parents:

Your child is much younger than the recommended age for access to most social media platforms (TikTok, Instagram, YouTube, Snapchat, Facebook, WhatsApp). Your child should not have access to these forms of social media. They do not possess the emotional intelligence to navigate this complex world.
